Some aspects of respect that parents should teach children include:

Good manners - Teaching your children good manners can have benefits that last them a lifetime. Good manners are a demonstration of respect. By practicing good manners, children discover that all relationships benefit from the demonstration of respect shown to others.

Tolerance is essential for effective communication. Tolerance includes accepting others just as they are; it also involves recognizing your own limitations. Demonstrating tolerance allows for the development of responsibility and is a mature demonstration of respect for self and others.

Listening - Listening is an essential tool for effective communication. Positive communication is a demonstration of respect. Children who know how to listen intently, not interrupt, and take turns in conversation benefit from these abilities and demonstrate respect to others. Listening can help avoid or resolve conflicts, making life more peaceful.

Open-mindedness - Teaching your children open-mindedness helps them avoid judgmental postures and allows them to become kind, caring adults. Accepting diversity is a form of open-mindedness that will benefit your children throughout their lives. Respect demands open-mindedness, and the benefits of maintaining an open mind can be enormous.

One of the best ways to teach children respect is to model the behavior; children are great at copying our behaviors. The benefits of teaching children respect will last them a lifetime and doing so is an important part of effective parenting.
